Topics covered in the first episodes included mental health status in the community and barriers that lead to youth homelessness. 


In Memory





Br. David is in Toronto, Ontario. He professed solemn vows in 1985. He has served in numerous leadership positions since that time, including 10 years as Superior General and 27 years as Executive Director for Good Shepherd Ministries, Toronto, Ontario. As Provincial Superior, Br. David is responsible for the overall governing of the Province with the aid of his Councillors and for guaranteeing respect and promotion of the values and principles of the Order.
